Created under the Affordable Care Act, the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Innovation (CMMI) was intended to lower costs and improve care. **After 15 years, it has failed to deliver on those promises while expanding bureaucratic control over healthcare decisions.**

THE CASE FOR ELIMINATING CMMI

CMMI Has Failed Taxpayers

- Projected to save \$2.8 billion from 2011-2020 but instead cost taxpayers \$5.4 billion.
- Expected to waste an additional \$1.3 billion through 2030.

CMMI's Models Don't Work

- Only [four](#) of its 70 models have qualified for nationwide expansion.
- Major models like Primary Care First, Making Care Primary, and the ESRD Treatment Choice model were [terminated](#) early after failing to achieve meaningful improvements.

CMMI Lacks Accountability

- Operates with limited congressional oversight.
- Unelected bureaucrats can reshape healthcare policy without congressional approval.

Americans Are Concerned

- [78%](#) of voters express concern about increased government influence over healthcare decisions.
